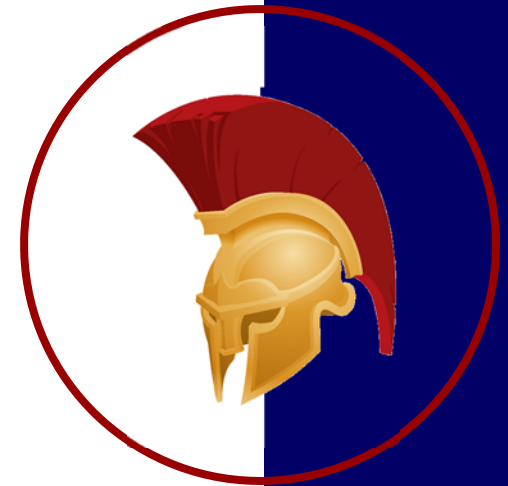

# Dual Credit

Dual Credit, referred to as concurrent enrollment in the School Code is intended to encourage a broader range of students to experience postsecondary coursework. The Pennsylvania Dual Credit Program allows school districts to partner with eligible postsecondary partners to offer high school students the opportunity to earn academic or career technical credit while completing their high school requirements.

## Process

- Students shall request to meet with assigned guidance counselor to discuss the proposed course and number of credits sought.
- Parental notification and signed consent is required.

## Details

- The number of credits and weight assigned to course work taken through an alternative delivery method shall be predetermined by the building principal and guidance counselor as part of the approval process before coursework is begun.
- Each 3 credit college course is equal to 1.0 credits that count towards graduation. Each dual credit course will carry a 1.10 weight and will be calculated into the student's grade point average and class rank.
- Grades earned in approved courses count toward a student's grade point average and class rank.



## Eligibility

Eligibility for student participation in a dual credit program will be based on the following criteria:

1. The student has satisfactorily completed the appropriate units of credit for his/her grade level and continues to make satisfactory progress within current grade level.
2. Students may take dual enrollment courses during the summer. Summer courses will not count towards credit for student graduation requirements.
3. In order to participate in the Dual Credit program, the student must maintain a secondary school grade point average of 93%.
4. Students must be in good standing and must meet district attendance criteria.
5. The course must be approved by the Superintendent or designee.
6. North Schuylkill is providing courses at Bloomsburg University. Students may take a minimum of 4 dual credit courses, 2 per semester and a maximum of 8 dual credit courses, 4 per semester.
7. Juniors may participate in Bloomsburg's ACE Program, and must take a minimum of 6 credits with a maximum of 8 credits. These particular students will not be eligible to qualify for Salutatorian or Valedictorian and must maintain a secondary school grade point average of 95%.
8. North Schuylkill is providing on campus courses through LCCC. Students may take 1 course per semester.
9. Student assumes the responsibility for all tuition and fees, textbooks, and transportation.
10. If a student withdraws from the course, student will receive a failing grade and will be recorded on the student's academic record (transcript).
